

Corporate Liability under the MACC Act: Building Adequate Procedures for your Organisation

The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission Act 2009 (MACC Act) has recently been amended to include a provision on Corporate Liability. This provision imposes criminal liability on a commercial organisation for the corrupt acts of its employees which are done to obtain or retain business or an advantage for the organisation. A commercial organisation is able to defend itself from such liability if it can show it has "adequate procedures" in place to prevent corrupt practices in relation to its business.

This talk will introduce and take you through the implications of the Corporate Liability provision that will apply to all commercial organisations from June 2020. It will also focus on how commercial organisations can prepare themselves by developing adequate procedures pursuant to the recently issued Guidelines on Adequate Procedures and in accordance with international standards.

The talk will be led by our Head of Corporate & Commercial, Mr Chew Phye Keat, who was also an Executive Committee Member of Transparency International - Malaysia and is currently Chairman of the International Chamber of Commerce, Malaysia Chapter.
