Noor Azanida bt Alladin commenced her legal practice in 2018, focusing on litigation and advisory briefs across a range of areas, with a primary emphasis on finance, banking (both conventional and Islamic), receivership, insolvency, as well as corporate restructuring and disputes.

She has appeared before all levels of the Malaysian Judiciary, both as lead counsel and in a supporting role to the partner leading the matter. She was recently admitted as an Associate Member of the Insolvency Practitioners Association of Malaysia.

Azanida was recently involved in a cross-border insolvency dispute, which concerned a challenge to a claim of lien, and issues relating to the recovery and realisation of foreign assets in Malaysia.

She also succeeded before the Federal Court in defending one of Malaysia's major banks against a fraud claim concerning the procurement of continuing guarantees as security for banking facilities.

Beyond litigation, she frequently supports clients from diverse industries in both court proceedings and negotiated out-of-court settlements. Her advisory work covers strategy, risk and crisis management, and compliance matters. She often translates legal outcomes into practical policies and agreements that directly impact organisational and workforce relations.
